CHECKING WEBSITES

Checking relevant websites can play an important role in debunking misinformation. These websites will help corroborate or debunk the post.



Checklist for verifying websites:



Domain Names: Be wary of domain names that claim to be a credible source but isn't. For example, unusual top-level domain names like "com.co" are usually suspect. For example, abcnews.com.co is a fake website. abcnews.go.com is the correct one.



About Us: This section can reveal more details about the content you are investigating. Does this page sound legit and convincing?



Is it a satire website? – There are times when an entire website is about satire and parody. Do not mistake the contents for misinformation or fake news.

Example: Indian parody news website: <https://thespoofnews.com/>



Spelling Errors: Spelling errors, grammatical mistakes, syntax errors, careless misrepresentation – these are all give-aways that the website you are investigating is not credible. Make sure you are alert.



Assess Content: Is the content constantly driven by one ideology? If yes, content can be driven by propaganda as well.

Remember the **A-B-C-D-E** of checking websites:

Assess the content

Beware of fake website links

Check the About Us page

Examine the content for errors
